<u>Unit 01: Creating Order</u> (20 days) <u>Unidad 01: Estableciendo el orden</u> During this unit, students expand their understanding of rules to apply to an understanding of how laws provide order and stability to communities. Students also expand on their understanding of authority figures to include an understanding of the role of public officials.
