ASSISTANTSHIP GENERAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Must be a fully admitted graduate student who is working towards a master's or doctoral degree.
- 2. Must maintain a good academic standing with a minimum overall GPA of 3.250.
- 3. Assistantship recipients must be full-time students enrolled in 9 graduate hours each Fall and Spring semester, or 6 graduate hours for Summer, while receiving funding.

FELLOWSHIP AND SCHOLARSHIP GENERAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Must be a fully admitted graduate student who is working towards a master's or doctoral degree.
- 2. Must maintain a good academic standing with a minimum overall GPA of 3.500.
- Scholarship and Fellowship recipients must enroll in 6 graduate hours each semester, including Summer, while receiving funding.

INSTRUCTIONS

In order to receive full consideration for financial assistance, applicant must submit a complete application with all required attachments and/or documents (i.e., application, resume, essay, letters of recommendation, and copy of unofficial transcripts) and meet all eligibility requirements by April 1. The TAMIU Graduate Financial Assistance is not renewed automatically; students must apply every year. (On the top right hand corner of each document/page please include your name and ID number.)

GRE or GMAT is not required for Business Administration, Professional Accountancy, or Information Systems applicants whose undergraduate upper level GPA is a 3.0 or higher, or have earned an advanced U.S. degree. Provisional admission

Official Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT) scores are required ONLY if pursuing a Master's degree in Counseling Psychology or a Doctor of Philosophy in International Business Administration. GRE or GMAT is not required for Business Administration, Professional Accountancy, or Information Systems applicants whose undergraduate upper level GPA is a 3.0 or higher, or have earned an advanced U.S. degree. The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is required of all students having academic studies from a country where English is not the native language. - 6. An Official Certificate of Graduation, indicating the degree and date of completion, which must be translated to English and sent directly from the institution. Students who graduated from a Mexican institution must present an original Título to be photocopied. The Carta de Pasante will not be accepted.
- 7. A completed Financial Statement form. This form requires official certification of sources of funds from the student.
- 8. A Letter of Sponsorship is required from the party who will financially support the applicant during pursuit of degree.
- 9. A Bank Statement certifying the sponsor to have sufficient funds indicated on the Financial Statement Form and dated within six months of the first enrollment according to the dates listed below:
